



Coffee Hour: Volunteer to Set Up, Clean Up





Calendar year-to-date giving reports will be available during the first week of January 2024. The reports will be:

- Emailed to those with a valid opted-in email address on file on or before Jan. 5.
- Sent via U.S. Mail to the address on file for those without email addresses or those who have opted out of using email communication.

Paper copies will be provided on request.



Giving reports are based on the calendar year for tax records and reporting. But please be aware that Faith Lutheran's fiscal year is March 1-February. As a result, your records show:

- January and February giving in the fund year 2023.
- March through December giving in the fund year 2024.

Helpful Tips Provide Guidance as You Contemplate Year-End Contributions to Faith

As we prayerfully and joyfully await the coming of our Savior, the calendar year and the tax year are drawing to a close, so it's time to prepare. Here's helpful information:

- You will receive year-end giving statements from Faith by Jan. 6 (see story on previous page).
- To check the status of your 2023 pledge or to request an early copy of your giving statement, contact Financial Secretary Patty McKee, 941-921-3709 or financialsecretary@faithlutheransrq.com.



Thank offerings to Faith that are made before year-end qualify for an income tax deduction. If you are contemplating a year-end gift, you can:

- Write a check or give electronically via the Online Giving page on the Faith website, faithlutheransrq.com/onlinegiving. Donations of record qualify if you itemize.
- **Donate appreciated securities** that you have owned for more than one year, thus eliminating tax on the appreciation. Consult with your tax advisor, and keep in mind that the gift date is the date on which the securities enter Faith's account.
- Open a Donor Advised Fund (DAF) or contribute through your existing DAF.
 You can request a grant from your DAF to support Faith or any of Faith's mission funds.
- Make a gift from your Individual Retirement Account (IRA). If you are 70 1/2 or older, you can transfer funds directly to Faith to eliminate taxes on any gift up to \$100,000. If you must make required minimum distributions, this is a great way to meet all or part of that obligation.

NOTE: 2024 giving envelopes are scheduled for delivery before the end of December. They will be available in the narthex as soon as they arrive.

S.U.R.E. Team Advocates for Care, Funding to Help End Homelessness





No season of the year is quite like Christmas. Most of us have wonderful memories of happy family gatherings, the smell of fresh-baked cookies, the Christmas tree, the church decorated with evergreens and poinsettias, and wonderful music of the season. As a

contemporary musical proclaims, "It's the most wonderful time of the year!" That's especially true for those of us who call ourselves "Christians."

We get our name from the Savior born in Bethlehem. Believers in that Savior were first called "Christians" or "Christ's Ones" at Antioch. Through faith in Jesus Christ, we are "Christ's Ones." We belong to him for time and for eternity. We are "Christ's Ones" because the Father sent the Son to be the Savior of the world (1 John 4:14).

We give in response to God's love for us, knowing all that we have belongs to God.

As the calendar year draws to a close, the needs here at Faith Lutheran are great, but as we join together in a sacrifice of praise to God through a special Christmas offering, the needs can be met — and more. Thanks for prayerfully considering your response to God's love for you, and for giving as God enables and leads in your life. May the joy of the Christ Child who became our Savior be yours.

Consider Donating Altar Flowers

- At church, complete an Altar Flowers envelope with your payment, and place it in the offering plate. Indicate your wish to keep or donate the flowers on the donation board in fellowship hall.
- By mail, send payment with a note indicating your desired date and dedication, and if you want to keep the flowers or donate them.
