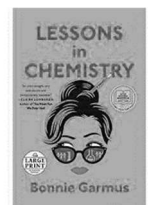


## Help Advocate for Affordable Housing

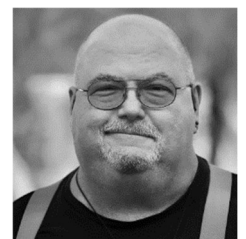


## Be There to Learn How 'Laughter Saves Lives'
