Pastor David was baptized, took his first Holy Communion and was confirmed at St. John's Lutheran, Richardton, N.D. He later graduated from the University of North Dakota, Grand Forks, with a Bachelor of Arts in Psychology and Music, then graduated from Northwestern Lutheran Theological Seminary, St. Paul, Minn. (later named Luther Seminary). In 1971, he took a seminar journey to Israel and Palestine.

He served First Lutheran, Lake Lillian, Minn. (1973-1978), First Lutheran, Cosmos, Minn. (1977-1978), Family of God Lutheran, East Forks, Minn. (1978-1989), Servant of Christ Lutheran, Chaplin, Minn. (1996-2008) before joining Hackensack Meridian Health Care as manager of pastoral care for hospice (1996-2008), where he managed four hospice chaplains. Following retirement, he has served as interim pastor for Faith Lutheran (this congregation), Sarasota, Fla. (June-September 2020), Emmanual Lutheran, Venice, Fla., (June-July 2023) and continues to serve as interim at Our Savior Lutheran, Nokomis, Fla.

Pastor David's extra-parish experiences including serving as a visiting goodwill pastor for two months in 1995 at the Evangelical Lutheran Church, Nigeria, Africa; and leading Summer Bible School in 2004 with children of the Cree Nation for the Lutheran Association of Missionaries and Pilots, Wabasca, Alberta, Canada.
