Born in Springfield, Ohio, Pastor Larry moved to Menasha, Wisc., in during junior. year of high school where he met his bride-to-be, Ann. He began studies in forestry and wildlife management at Central State College (Wisconsin) and transferred to Wittenberg University in Ohio when he made the decision to prepare for the ministry.
