Gospel: John 2:1-11

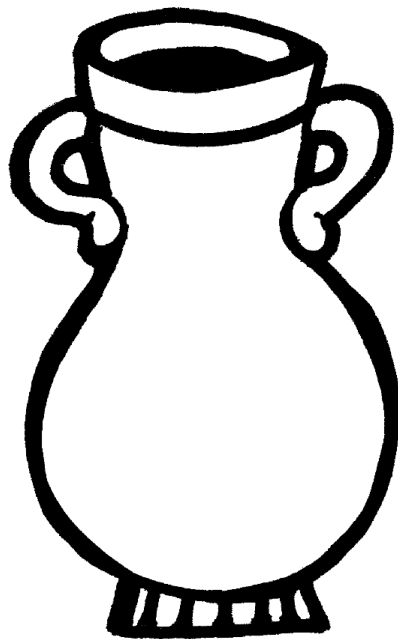
